19 Correspondence – 20mph Consultation

19 (a)

Comment: I notice there is a poster at the entrance to Geffery Close announcing a formal consultation for a 20-mph speed limit within the village, for which I am fully in favour. I have not seen any other posters in the village and everyone I have spoken to is unaware of this public consultation. Therefore, I urge the Parish Council to take immediate action to publicise this more widely, particularly as the closing date for comments is 7thJune.

I have two comments I believe the Council should raise:

19 (b)

- 1. The road up to Home Park off the A38 is narrow particularly past the farm entrance and there are often cars parked which requires care. I consider the 20-mph limit should start immediately on the Blunts-road, past the entrance to Home Park and up to the fork in the road past the dwelling north of Home Park.
- 2. Similarly, I consider there should be a 20-mph restriction on West Lane past the new dwellings, where I understand there have been speeding incidents in the recent past

I have tried to raise these points with Cornwall Council on their web site so far without success. Please ensure this enquiry is raised at the next Parish Council meeting.

I am sure it's something which has been discussed, but I was wondering if there is any likelihood of getting a 20mph limit on Tideford Rd? The pavement is incomplete and the road is well used by pedestrians, as well as cars at speeds greatly exceeding 20mph. I read that Tideford and St Germans are hoping to get a limit put in place and can't see that Tideford Rd should be any different.

Letter from the Parish Council Chairman to all Councillors

As you are all aware, we as a Parish Council have explored the concept of bringing a 20mph speed limit to all the current 30mph limits roads in the Landrake village for the last Three years, and have explored various funding options to facilitate a 20mph restriction in the village, but could not attract the required funding of this project, and we had agreed to await the possibility of the Cornwall County Council plans for the 20mph speed limit project to be undertaken and implemented by Cornwall County Council

I expect you have all seen the information posters that have been put up in various poles and post throughout our village, which have been put by Cornwall County Council, explaining the 20mph speed limit that Cornwall County are now proposing to install in the village of Landrake.

Having looked at the proposals, I am in full agreement to the proposals of the 20mph speed limits in the village, but in my opinion two sections of our village roads have not been added to this project, they are as follows –

1/ Pound Hill, from the main A38 to the top of Pound Hill. This section of road is not being covered by the project and will remain a 30mph zone. I disagree with this as this small stretch of road is very busy at most times of the day, and extremely busy at school traveling times, 8.15 to 9.15 and again at 3.15 to 4.30. It is also the main route for pedestrians going to the recreation field at the top of Pound Hill. It is also used by a lot of walkers and runners out undertaking daily exercise and feel-good activities. Any pedestrians crossing the bottom of the Pound Hill road beside the A38, either to go to West Lane or to access the footpath to Home Park and Congdons Orchard at busy times of the day have difficulty crossing the Pound Hill road because of the shear amount of noise that comes from the heavy traffic on the A38, and is also not helped by the lack of vision up the hill until they have stepped out into the road. A reduced speed of 20mph in this section of the road of Pound Hill would help both Vehicles and pedestrians navigate the road in a much safer situation. There is a very busy farm entrance onto that stretch of road from Pound farm. There are also seven residential houses on the first 100 meters of Pound Hill from the A38, and from the exit of Home Park there is a big parking problem on the junction from Home Park onto Pound Hill road as there are very often builders vans and large vehicles parked on this junction, which makes it very dangerous for both vehicles and also pedestrians exiting the Home Park junction.

2/ West Lane There is already a 40mph section off the A38 down West Lane for about twenty to thirty metres, but the West Lane Road then goes to a 60mph limit past the new Congdons Orchard development of Eight residential houses. This section of the road has no walkways or pavements for pedestrians and pushchairs, and with the vehicles of the housing development exiting Congdons Orchard entrance are at high risk of speeding vehicles at up to 60mph at this point of the entrance to Congdons Orchard development. As you are aware, we as a Parish Council tried to get a speed restriction for this stretch of West Lane by Congdons Orchard restricted to 30mph but could not afford the approximate cost of £10,000

to undertake this task. I feel this is a golden opportunity to add this section of West Lane onto the 20mph project, being funded by Cornwall County Council.

This is a very important road safety project for the village of Landrake, and I urge you all to please email your support and comments for this project as a whole, and importantly to add the 20mph restrictions to the sections of both Pound Hill and West Lane, , so that Chris can send a Parish Council response under delegated authority to Cornwall County Council. Your response to this needs to get to our clerk by the 5th of June, as the Landrake Parish Councils views have to arrive at Cornwall County Council no later than 7th June 2024.

You could also go onto the relevant website at www.cornwall.gov.uk/TrafficConsult to also give your own views on this project, especially to try and bring the additional 20mph restrictions to the Pound Hill and West Lane sections. This is a great opportunity to try and get West Lane and Pound Hill sections onto this project.

I would as of you all as Parish Councillors to please talk to all those parishioners that you know to inform them of this project and has the to go onto the website and give their views on this important project.

I will ask Martin Worth as our County councillor, if he would also support us on this project, and the extra additions of the West Lane and Pound Hill sections
